This week, our Foundation children have been hard at work rehearsing for their much-anticipated Nativity play.



The classroom has been filled with the joyful sounds of festive **songs**, cheerful **giggles**, and the rustling of costumes as the children bring the story

of Christmas to life.



Year 1

Year 1 have really enjoyed their topic about 'Toys **Through Time'** this half term. We have been learning about what toys are made of and how they have changed over the years. We even had a trip to the **Toy Museum**, where we got to play with lots of different toys. Some of the toys we looked at were really old!



In English, we have been reading a book called 'Lost in the Toy Museum', where a very serious bear called **Bunting** gets lost. In the end, he finds

adventure. We had to use some of the characters from the story to create our own story about the Toy Museum. We even made a 'missing' poster to help find Bunting.



Year 2

The children in Year 2 began their learning this half term with an exciting trip to both Leicester Cathedral and The King Richard III Visitor Centre to enhance their knowledge and understanding of **Kings and Queens** in British history.

The children have also enjoyed finding out about hereditary monarchies and researching who Elizabeth Woodville and Lady Jane Grey were and how they became British monarchs.

In Art, the children have been using different skills and techniques to draw portraits and self-portraits and have looked at facial proportions to help them create their own portrait of our current monarch, King Charles III. We think they look amazing!

Year 3



In Year 3, students thoroughly enjoyed the process of creating mechanical Christmas cards featuring **linkages** and **levers**. After studying the function and mechanics of these systems, they applied their understanding to design and construct their own unique Christmas cards, ensuring the inclusion of functional lever and linkage mechanisms. The children demonstrated exceptional creativity and produced very impressive cards, which were ready to take home just in time for Santa's visit!



Year 4

Year 4 have been working on an exciting art project focused on creating **dragon eyes**. We have learned how to sketch, shade, and add intricate details to our designs. Using **watercolours**, we practiced blending techniques to bring our sketches to life.



Our next step is to design our dragon eyes, and then we'll bring them to life using **clay**—we are super excited to get started!



Year 5

This term, Year 5 have embarked on an unforgettable journey back in time to the **Viking Age**. Our young historians have explored the daring world of fearless Norse warriors, skilled seafarers, and brilliant traders, uncovering the fascinating legacy of the Vikings in Britain.

From investigating how the Vikings lived, worked, and voyaged across the seas, to debating whether they were ruthless raiders or clever settlers, the children have been captivated by the dramatic stories of this era. They've uncovered treasures as they examined Viking artifacts and practiced interpreting historical evidence like true archaeologists.

Highlights of our learning included:

- ☐ Designing Viking **longships** and imagining what life was like aboard these iconic vessels.
- ☐ Mapping Viking **raids** and settlements, imagining the thrill of exploration.





Year 3 and 4 thoroughly enjoyed their trip to the church for 'The Journey to Bethlehem'. They learned about the nativity story in an engaging and meaningful way, bringing the events leading up to Jesus' birth to life.

The children behaved exceptionally well throughout the visit and represented the school with pride.



Year 6



Year 6 had a brilliant day at Warning Zone in Leicester. They learnt important life messages from personal to online safety engaging in stimulating, memorable and vital experiences helping them to prepare for the future.



The children were amazing and participated in the activities maturely, particularly when learning about the possible risks for young people throughout their teenage life. What super stars, Year 6!



Throughout the year, the whole school is treated to an entertaining Bible story through the wonderful acting of our friends at Open the Book.
